
members who always continue to be actively involved in ensuring our school is a remarkable place to work, to learn and to play.





THE FIRST FEW WEEKS...

During these days in the first few weeks of school teachers will focus on topics such as:

- Entry and dismissal routines
- · Movement in and around the school
- Transition times
- Using the school washroom, hand-washing, and coughing/ sneezing etiquette
- Eating lunch/ snacks, etc.
- · Mental health and well-being check-ins
- Support Diagnostic assessment to plan for intervention to address learning gaps
- Getting to know their learners
- · Building a faith-filled community

Classroom Allergens



As we begin a new school year, we would like to inform you that Divine Mercy is an allergen aware school. There are pupils and staff in attendance who suffer from severe and life threatening allergies to certain foods, such as dairy, peanut and nut products. Exposure to even the smallest quantities can cause severe life threatening reactions. Anaphylaxis is a severe and life threatening allergic reaction. The most common allergen triggers are food, insect stings, medications, and latex. An anaphylactic reaction involves symptoms from two or more body systems. We would

appreciate the cooperation of the entire school community by NOT sending any lunches or snacks that contain nut or nut by products which could potentially harm a pupil. Please make sure that all of your children's caregivers are aware of the food restrictions. Please do not send food for birthdays or special occasions . We look forward to your co-operation in making this a safe year for all of our pupils

Medical Supports

All students who have been diagnosed by a doctor with asthma, anaphylaxis, diabetes, or seizures must have completed the necessary Plan of Care Forms. These forms only need to be completed once (unless the diagnosis or medication has changed) and they will be stored in your child's OSR. If your child requires an epi pen or puffer and they must carry it on them at all times this



must be clearly indicated on the Plan of Care, otherwise it will be stored in the main office. The Authorization for the storage and administration of medication must be completed annually. If your child requires any other type of medicine to be taken during school hours (Advil, Tylenol etc.) you must complete the Authorization for the storage and administration of medication form and it will be stored in the main office. Please send the required forms and medicine to the main office in a clearly labelled bag

Concussions and Head Injuries

Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board has developed a Concussion Policy and Guidelines for students who have been diagnosed with a concussion by either a medical doctor or nurse practitioner. School staff cannot diagnose a concussion. Anytime a student reports to the office with a head injury, the parent/guardian will be contacted and the incident will be entered into the school's "Documentation of Head Injuries" log. This is precautionary only, and we ask that you check your child when he/she gets home for any signs of a concussion or illness. We will also encourage you to go onto our school website, where a brochure containing information about Concussions is provided. Again this is a precautionary measure and for information purposes.



Punctuality & Safety

- Please do your best to arrive to school on time! Students arriving late for class in the morning are missing valuable instruction time.
- Please be reminded NOT TO PARK OR STOP your car for an extended period in the Kiss & Ride lane at anytime. Please observe parking signs. Please also do your best to move up in the Kiss & Ride lane to allow for as many cars as possible. If you need to park, then you are able to access our new parking lot.



- Photography while on school property: We discourage photography on school property due to privacy and safety concerns.
- We discourage adults from observing children during lunch and recess play time. We strive to maintain a safe environment at all times for our staff and students.

SCHOOL HOURS

Arrival

Students will be provided access to the school beginning at 8:15 am each morning. Please note that there is no teacher supervision of students in the school yard prior to this time. Parents are not permitted to enter the school doors with their child(ren). Doors will be locked again after the bell.



The school cannot assume responsibility for private property. Please remind your children that if they are going to ride their bikes to school, to please ensure that they are properly locked in the school bike rack at the front of the school. Students are asked to walk bicycles on and off school property. Unfortunately, we have no area to lock up skateboards/scooters, so we discourage students from bringing them to school.

Dismissal:

We will be dismissing students at the conclusion of the school day, at 3:00pm. Students will be dismissed in the same area as they entered in the morning. If you have a child in the primary grades, teachers will wait with them until they are directly given to an adult listed on his/ her pick up list. Teachers will be asking parents to inform them of their dismissal plans. If you have an older child, please ensure that they know how they are getting home and with whom. Bus students will begin loading the bus right at the bell.

Make a plan!

It is so important for families to always establish a plan for how children are getting home. Please be sure to share this plan with your child's teacher. If the plan should change, please be sure to let the school know, so we are aware.

Kiss and Ride

Thank you for your continued cooperation and adherence to our Kiss and Ride policies and procedures. Please be reminded NOT TO PARK OR STOP your car for an extended period in the Kiss & Ride lane at anytime. Please also do your best to move up in the Kiss & Ride lane to allow for as many cars as possible. If you need to park, then you are able to access our parking lot.



Bus Loading Zone

Please be reminded that the front of the school is designated as a "Bus Loading Zone." Parents/guardians are not permitted to pick up or drop off students in this zone. The safety of our students is our priority. Please drop off or pick up students in the designated school parking lot or the Kiss and Ride area.



Emergency Contact and Verification forms

It is important that we are able to contact someone in the case of an emergency. Please complete the emergency student verification sheets that will be sent home the first weeks of school.



Remember that those people you list as contacts are automatically given permission to pick up your child from school. They are needed in case we cannot contact you. It makes sense to have a relative, neighbour, or friend who lives close to the school and is available during the day to pick up your child in case of illness, concussion, or changes of clothes that may be required

Lunch Routines: Dropping off lunch

Please ensure that your child arrives at school with all the items they need for the day. We realize that there will be occasions where students forget something at home. You can ring the doorbell outside for the office, and parents/guardians who are dropping off items/lunches for their children will leave at the front table upon entering the school. Please label the item clearly with your child's name and class.



Paperless snacks/lunches

Students and staff are encouraged to be environmentally friendly by reducing the amount of paper and plastic waste from lunches and snacks. Students are reminded that food wrappers should be disposed of before going out onto the yard and to use the classroom garbage cans for any waste. As a result, the teachers will give the students an opportunity to have their snack inside either before or after recess. Snacks are not allowed on the playground.

Going out for lunch

Please inform your child's teacher of regular lunch arrangements for your child, using the verification form sent home. Also, for safety reasons, please be advised that a note signed and dated to the classroom teacher must occur each time there is a change in the routine. This is especially important for a child who has permission to leave school property during the noon hour who normally stays for lunch. As a school staff, it is important for us to know each time a child leaves our care at noon hour that permission has been given and that parents know the exact whereabouts of their child(ren).

Drink Breaks

Students are encouraged to bring their own reusable water bottle to school for water consumption. The water filling stations are also open and students will be able to refill their water bottles

throughout the day. Please clearly label your child's water bottle to avoid confusion with other students.

Safety in the Schoolyard

Children need frequent reminders that name-calling, put-downs and violence are never appropriate responses to disagreements or arguments, regardless of the provocation. Parents are urged to rehearse assertiveness skills with their children such as saying firmly, — "Please Stop", "I don't like it when.." "Leave me alone"

Playground Safety Rules:

- * Respect each other by being polite, friendly and co-operative
- * Keep hands and feet to yourself
- * Allow others to join in your games
- * Play fairly and safely
- * Play with acceptable toys and equipment
- * Respect school property
- * Line up quietly when the bell rings
- * Avoid conflicts and injuries
- * NO standing in the middle or walking through active games
- * NO leaving school property
- * NO name-calling or making fun of others, using inappropriate language or gestures
- * NO fighting, pushing, tripping, lifting, grabbing, body-checking, scratching, pinching, spitting or biting
- * NO unsafe or rough games: wrestling, tackling, play fighting

Policy on Cell phone use and PEDS



The Dufferin-Peel Catholic District School Board has the following policy regarding **P**ersonal **E**lectronic **D**evices in place for all schools.

The Board recognizes the importance of the use of PED's by students at school and the benefits in their classroom. As part of our policy, students may bring their own device (B.Y.O.D.) **for learning purposes**. As part of our efforts to promote and maintain a positive Catholic climate in our schools, all PEDs must be kept

out of sight, turned off, and not used within school premises or during school-sanctioned activities; unless the classroom teacher grants specific permission for use.

This policy applies to field trips, retreats, sporting events, etc. as well as daily classroom activities. Personal Electronic devices (PEDs) include, but are not limited to cell phones, iPods, iPads, cameras, ...

Please note that <u>it is optional for students to bring their devices to school and it is their responsibility to follow the school and Board policies</u> set out in the "**Personal Electronic Device used with Wi-Fi Network Student Agreement.**"

The STOPR website provides up to date delay and inclement weather cancellation information in addition to policy, procedures and frequently asked questions. Please consider registering for notice of alerts regarding issues such as buses running behind schedule. The STOPR website also allows parents to access information specific to "what school do I attend" and "am I eligible for transportation". This site also provides parents access to specific bus stop location and pick up and drop off times for their children if eligible for transportation. You can also receive up-to-date information by following STOPR on Twitter @STOPRinfo.

All transported kindergarten and grade 1 students are required to be met by a parent/ caregiver when disembarking from their bus on their return trip from school. Courtesy Seating Requests will be finalized by early October.

Bus Safety

If your child rides the bus daily, it is important that they are aware of the safety rules on the bus. Students are required to:

- Listen to the Bus Driver at all times and report any problems or injuries to him/her
- Go directly to their assigned seat and remain seated during the entire bus ride
- Do not eat, drink, swear, fight or chew gum on the bus

- Do not put arms out the window, or throw items or garbage out the window
- If any damage to the seat of bus is caused, students will be held responsible
- Be at least 5 minutes early at your bus stop to ensure that you don't miss the bus

Improper conduct on the bus will be dealt with at the Office. Repeated or serious incidents can result in busing privileges being suspended or removed. Please review these rules with your child. Taking the bus is a privilege, not a right.
